## **Ministry to the Seafarers**

I have visited 277 ships so far this year, though I am spending more time on each ship helping the men that I meet. Communication with the seafarer's families remains the number one priority for them. Providing phone cards and then setting up their phones for the internet does take up a lot of my time but it is such a help for these men. I also help the seafarers with welfare issues. I met a 3rd officer called Joey who was getting ready to leave his ship and fly back to the Philippines because his mum was seriously ill. She sadly passed away before he had even left the ship; she was only 59 years old. I came back to the ship the following day when the taxi was due to pick up Joey for the airport. I gave him a couple of phone cards and some cash so he could buy some food in the airport. He told me that this was the first time he was leaving a ship for home with a sad face. He contacted me again half way through his journey to thank me for caring for him and for my prayers.

I met a young Italian seafarer one day who needed my help. He confessed to being very unhappy due to being bullied on his ship by senior officers. He is paid for eight hours work per day but is actually made to work twelve hours. He told me when he is in his cabin on his own, he cries. I took the opportunity to bring words of comfort and to pray for him and to remind him that I care and so does God! That brought a smile to his face. He has since finished his contract and is now home. I have just met a seafarer called Francis who had joined his ship six days ago but unfortunately his luggage decided to go somewhere else! He has borrowed clothes up to the day that I met him. I immediately went up to the shopping mall and bought him back some new clothes. To say he was pleased is an understatement! There are many more stories of seafarers not being paid, being over worked and struggling with health problems to name a few. I know the Lord is their ever present help in times of trouble; I am there to make sure they know that.

I also meet seafarers who love Jesus but sometimes find it very difficult to maintain a healthy walk with the Lord whilst be away from home for many months. When I share with them the promises of our Saviour, their love for Him is quickly rekindled.

I continue to give out a lot of Gospel booklets and DVD's which soon run out if my stock isn't replenished. However, three wonderful supporters recently brought me 1,600 *Missing Peace* booklets and 500 *Knowing God Personally* booklets and 100 DVD's! I have also been so encouraged by an additional £500 gift to be used for literature. This enables me to distribute generously to each ship. Praise God for His provision!
