Ministry to the Seafarers

2016 saw me visit nearly 600 ships of all shapes and sizes. It was very busy over the Christmas period with hundreds of Christmas presents given out. It is a particularly difficult time of year for seafarers to be away from loved ones and so I do my best to make them feel cared for and encouraged. It is also an opportunity to remind them about the greatest gift given to humanity, which is Jesus Christ. The 'Why Christmas?' booklet helps to make clear the true meaning of Christmas.

In the autumn of 2016 I helped an Indian seafarer who was being treated appallingly on his ship. He grabbed my arm as I was about to leave his ship and asked if I could help him. The conversation was very 'cloak and dagger' because he didn't want the captain or the other officers to know that he had asked for my support. He later told me that he had thoughts of suicide and had hit rock bottom. And so with God's ever-present help, I was able to get him off the ship and get him unpaid wages of £8,500. We remain in contact and I have reminded him that the Lord heard his prayers in those terrible times.

I recently visited a young Ukrainian In hospital who was badly burnt due to a gas explosion on his ship. He visibly brightened up whilst talking with him and I'm sure the large chocolate bar that I brought him helped.

Praying over seafarers remains the highlight of what I do. Bringing the Lord into a discussion with a prayer or praying after someone has shared a need is quite powerful. When I pray I always feel that the spot light is directly on the Lord and not on me. In that moment of prayer, there is a tangible presence of the Lord.

I have seen an increase in apathy and indifference from seafarers in recent times to the message of the Gospel. I am not sure why this is, only that it has given me a determination to bring Christ back into the hearts and minds of those I meet. There are however those wonderful times when I meet someone on a ship who is eager to share with me their joy in knowing Jesus as their personal Saviour. The Christians I meet have little or no spiritual food for months at a time but I make sure that I leave them absolutely glowing after reaffirming the greatness of Christ in their lives.

My role as a port chaplain has also given me the chance to share something of my work with others in the shipping industry. I was asked recently ask to give a talk about my work with a Port Welfare Committee with various people attending including the Port Police, Port Managers, Port Health etc. That went well and I was then asked to share the same sort of thing with a Shipping Agent Company.

The Lord is certainly giving me some wonderful opportunities to talk about this ministry.
