## Ministry to the Seafarers

The amount of ships visited this year is down a bit, mainly due to our visit to New Zealand. However, I will have visited nearly 500 ships by Christmas time. Looking back over this last year, I am thrilled with the opportunities that God has given me in my ministry! The other day I spent about two hours talking to the Bosun on a large baulker ship. He shared with humility the sacrifice he was making in order to provide for his family. When his second child was born by caesarean section, he immediately went back to sea for 27 months so that he could pay the medical fees. (I hate not seeing Elvie for one week!) This seafarer wondered if his family appreciated the sacrifice he was making for them? It was making him sad and resentful. I shared with him that many are unaware of the sacrifice that our Heavenly Father has made for us! He wants us to know him and all that he has done on the Cross for us and to know all that he will do in the future for those who put their trust in him. The Bosun was visible moved by these words and said that he had never thought of God in this way before; A father who gives sacrificially for his children because he loves them! As well as many conversations with individuals I also get the chance to share the Gospel with everyone all at once on a ship. Twice this year I was asked by the Captain to share something with his crew. The mess room was quickly organised into rows of chairs with me up the end. The crew of about 18 guys sat and listened to me as I opened the Bible and shared the Gospel with them. I finished by praying a blessing over them to which a number asked for Bibles and thanked me for what I had shared. What a blessing and a privilege to have these opportunities!!
